
# Important Information for Library Users

If you want to borrow library books, you can reserve them by going to Access-It: <https://aiscloud.nz/HOWC/#!/dashboard> and then log on at Guest with your student ID Number, without the letters ST in front of it. **Leave the password field empty.**



Once you are logged in, you can search for books in the catalogue.

If you have decided you want to borrow a book, click on the cover of the book and drag it up to **Reserves** in the menu bar.

You can also click on **Make a reserve/booking** to reserve the book when you are looking at the book record.

We will get an email from you with your request(s). We will get the books from the library and will then email you when they are ready for you to pick up from us in the International Student's Common Room. Any problems come and see us in the common room.
