OPTION SELECTION ADVICE 2021

Key questions to ask...

- What qualifications do I want to gain while at school?
 - All students should aim for a **minimum** of NCEA Level 2.
 - University Entrance (UE) is a useful qualification even if you don't think you want to go on to university.
 - Merit and Excellence grades are important for entry to University courses and for scholarships.
 - Look at the National / NZ Certificates available that can lead on to apprenticeships / further study.
- What Vocational area am I interested in? (see right)
- What qualifications and courses do I need for tertiary study or for the work I hope to do when I leave school?
- Does my subject selection provide enough flexibility to change courses or direction in the future?
- Will I be appropriately challenged and have a good chance of success in this course?
- Do I have the **prerequisites** for the course?

Year 10 to Year 11: Choose 6 subjects

COMPULSORY

- **English:** Enrichment (ENGE) OR English (ENG) OR Essential English OR English Communication OR English Language (ENL)
- **Mathematics:** Maths External (MATE) OR Maths (MATH) OR Math Internal (MATI) OR Mathematics (MATU)
- **Science:** Science (SCI) OR Science Skills (SCS)

PREREQUISITES

- Taken in Y10 or by Head of Department (HOD) Approval: Art, Dance, Drama, Photo Design, Maori, French, Music
- 2 years music tuition: Music
- All other subjects open entry, however taking the subject in Year 10 is an advantage.
- All students in Year 10 choose a Science, either 11 Science (11SCI) or 11 Science Skills (11SCS). Taking 11 Science Double (11SCD) is an option subject, so you must take 11SCI.

Year 11 to Year 12: Choose 6 subjects

COMPULSORY

- English (ENG) OR English Enrichment (ENGE) OR Essential English (ESSE) OR English Communication (ENG) OR English Language (ENL) OR English Foundation (ENF).

PREREQUISITES

- General guide, 14 credits at previous year level, including genuine attempt at any External Exams*.

Year 12 to Year 13: Choose 5 subjects

PREREQUISITES

- General guide, 14 credits at previous year level, and attendance and genuine attempt at any External Exams*.

Select 5 Level 3 UE Pathway subjects (even if you don't think you want to go to university)	Select mostly Level 3 UE Pathway subjects (1 NCEA subject if a passion area)	Select a mix of Level 3 UE Approved subjects and NCEA subjects	Select a mix of Level 2 and 3 NCEA subjects

* Students with 14+ credits in the previous year may be granted entrance to that course the following year, provided they attend and attempt their external exams. Students with fewer credits may be offered entrance depending on the standards they have passed and space being available in the course.

★ Subjects not taken before may have subject prerequisites from English or History or Geography or Maths from the previous level. Check the subject prerequisites in the Subject Pathway Map on the Howick College website for specific details.

Pathways Map


