HOWICK COLLEGE DROP OFF/PICK UP ACCESS After School Pick Up

Between 3.10pm and 4.00pm, 15 buses arrive at and leave the College at about the same time as two other local schools finish. Heavy pedestrian and vehicular traffic at this time not only puts pressure on departing buses but also compromises the safety of our students.

Parents wishing to collect their children by car during this period must avoid the school bus bay, Gym and main car park areas. Parking may be available in surrounding streets which is less congested. Please talk to your child and agree on a location where they could be picked -up from. We suggest using the alternative entry/exit points located in **Rochester Crescent** and **Bledisloe Street** (See map attached).

Please note:

- Please follow the instructions of duty staff who are wearing high visibility vests.
- No stopping on dotted yellow lines at any time on Sandspit Road.
- All pedestrians must use the crossing.
- If you have parked in the bus bay prior to
 3.10pm you may only exit from 4.00pm
- Please remember that the speed limit on the school site is 15 KMH
